


Figure 1: The key points of CASAD-Benin in 2018

Message from the Executive Director



“CASAD-Benin continues to work with rural communities to alleviate poverty and food insecurity in a sustainable way.”



The year 2018 represents the third year of the implementation of the 2016-2020 strategic plan, which is operational and now guides the interventions of CASAD-Benin. This year, CASAD-Benin has continued to build the capacity of women farmers to be more resilient to climate change. Women farmers we train in agro-ecology are planning to celebrate local innovations in 2020. The celebration will be organized in collaboration with the multi-stakeholders platform for the promotion of peasant innovations in ecological agriculture and natural resources management, of which CASAD-Benin permanently provides the Secretariat.

During the year, we continued to work on the environmental implications of irrigation facilities. For this purpose, a research study was carried out by the CASAD-Benin team and was the subject of research for a trainee graduate student from CASAD-Benin at the final year of Risk and Disaster Management field. The study entitled « Hydro-agricultural development: diagnosis and assessment of environmental risks in Benin » has been successfully carried out, providing a better understanding of the characteristics of hydro-agricultural developments and associated environmental risks. It has been published in the European Academic Edition. CASAD-Benin has also worked hard to build the capacity of its team to be more technically professional serving rural communities to fight food insecurity, an ever-growing phenomenon in rural households in Benin. To this end, two members of the team CASAD-Benin participated in international methodological courses in the Universities of Gembloux and Wageningen. We have also strengthened our collaboration with other international institutions such as Agri Sud International of Senegal to cooperate on joint projects. During the year 2019, CASAD-Benin will develop activities that fall within the framework of the implementation of its Strategic Plan. Some previous projects will be relaunched in other areas of the country, namely the training and insertion of youth in agribusiness project. Similarly, new projects will be launched on miscellaneous fields such as capacity building for sustainable development actors in participatory action research, biogas, Health (HIV / AIDS), gender, education, climate change, ICT, etc.


CASAD-Benin has helped 60 households (with an average of 5 people per household), or more than 300 people through its Environment and Climate Change programme.

Our approach is to help communities better manage natural resources over the long term and move toward more resilient agroecological practices based on their endogenous knowledge.

In Benin, agroecological practices are now part of farmers' farming practices. This allows farmers to cope with the constraints of agricultural production.

CASAD-Benin has improved farmers' knowledge of agroecological practices through the organisation of citizen debates around agriculture with ecologist farmers of the Multi-stakeholder Platform for farmers 'innovation Promotion in Benin. This debate, referred to as « La nuit de l'agro-écologie » was an opportunity for farmers to explain the meaning of their commitment and for citizens, to meet those who daily practice agro-ecology, to discover their practices and to discuss them.

The rural community in the hilly area "les collines" lives mainly on agriculture and livestock. However, farmers are no longer able to meet their basic needs because of the upsurge of climate change crisis. CASAD-Benin helps reduce food and nutrition insecurity of the most vulnerable populations. Under the initiative of the Support project for gardening crop production and enhancing resilience « Projet d'Appui à la Production Maraîchère et de Renforcement de la Résilience (PAPMaRR) » of New land NGO, CASAD-Benin has been associated in the Agroecology component. CASAD-Benin, with its team of experts in Agroecological practices, has enhanced the adaptation abilities of gardening crop women farmers to climate hazards by training on more resilient agroecological practices based on their traditional knowledge. This year, CASAD-Benin continued to implement its training schedule for women farmers on other agroecological practices not addressed in 2017.

Scientific publications

Cet ouvrage intitulé "Aménagements hydro-agricole : Diagnostic et évaluation des risques environnementaux au Bénin" est un projet de recherche action participative du programme "Environnement et Changement Climatique" du Centre d'Actions pour la Sécurité Alimentaire et le Développement Durable (CASAD-Bénin). Il fournit une meilleure connaissance des caractéristiques des aménagements hydro-agricoles et des risques environnementaux associés. Après avoir identifié les différents types d'aménagements hydro-agricole (aménagement hydro-agricole par gravitaire, par pompage et par arrosage manuel) ; les sources des risques environnementaux que présente leur développement ont été identifiées et analysées. Il ressort que les différentes pratiques ont induit une dégradation du couvert végétal provoquant ainsi sa régression et une baisse de la fertilité des sols. L'ouvrage propose des mesures de gestion durable pour réduire les risques des aménagements hydro-agricoles sur l'environnement.

Alice Mahougnon Sakou est une ingénieure en Gestion des risques et Catastrophes. Titulaire d'une Maîtrise en Sciences naturelles, et d'un Master d'Intégration Régionale et Développement, elle est beaucoup plus préoccupée par les problèmes environnementaux. Travaillant avec passion et rigueur, elle se bâtit une solide réputation environnementale.

Aménagements Hydro-agricoles, Risques environnementaux, Bénin

This book entitled « Aménagements hydro-agricole : Diagnostic et évaluation au Bénin » is a participatory action research project of the Programme "Environment and Climate Change." implemented by The Actions for Food Security and Sustainable Development Centre (CASAD-Bénin). It provides a better understanding of the characteristics of hydro-agricultural facilities (hydro-agricultural facilities by gravity, pumping and manual watering); the sources of the environmental risks associated with their development have been identified and analysed. It appears that the different practices have led to a degradation of the vegetation, causing its regression and a decline in soil fertility. The book suggests sustainable management measures to reduce the risks of hydro-agricultural development on the environment.

During the third year, we will also work to strengthen our partnerships. We focus on long-term partnerships that contribute more to the achievement of our strategic objectives than to the specific objectives of a project.

👉 Youth access to employment

CASAD-Benin will continue to build the capacity of youth in agribusiness through its projects; with a particular emphasis on young women. CASAD-Benin will work with partners to support and installation of youth trained in agribusiness. In the same perspective of youth capacity building, CASAD-Benin will operationalize the OpportunitYoung platform to not only provide information, training opportunities, internships and conferences in the agricultural field, but also develop various themes such as agricultural entrepreneurship, agro-ecology, successful examples of peasant innovations and the drafting and management of a business plan. CASAD-Benin wants to develop through the OpportunitYoung Platform, training modules focused on specific capabilities.

👉 Improvement of farmers' resilience in Benin

CASAD-Benin will continue to support farmers in Benin. By capitalizing on farmers' innovations, our experiences and results of participatory research, new partnerships will be established to better enhance the resilience of farmers to environmental, climatic and anthropogenic pressures. Farmers' innovations will be emphasized to capitalize on them and promote sustainable family agriculture.
